“Here I Stand”

500 years ago, in 1517, Martin Luther launched the Reformation.

“GOD’S WORD IS TRUE from the very first verse. It’s the starting point that sits as the foundation of our worldview. God has revealed His truth to us through His Word, and we must evaluate the world around us in light of that reality. We begin not with the word of man, but with the inerrant Word of God.

Since the Bible is our authority, the Creation Museum explains how God’s Word comes to us through human authors. We also look at the attacks on Scripture throughout the ages, and how each of the attacks is rooted in the question that the serpent asked in the garden:

‘Has God indeed said?’ (Genesis 3:1).

One very important exhibit, especially in light of the 500th year anniversary of the Reformation, alludes to Martin Luther symbolically nailing the 95 theses to the door of the church in Wittenberg.

Visitors will notice, however, that the scroll itself does not show the 95 theses. Instead, it shares the well-known quote from Luther’s speech at the Diet of Worms in 1521:

Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason (for I do not trust either in the pope or in councils alone, since it is well known that they have often erred and contradicted themselves). I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not retract anything, since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience. I cannot do otherwise, here I stand, may God help me, Amen.

The rallying cry of the Reformation was *Sola Scriptura* (Scripture alone). In 2017, may that be the rallying cry for God’s people as well. In all of our thinking, may we be ‘bound by the Scriptures’ and may our ‘consciences be captive to the Word of God.’ Amen.”
