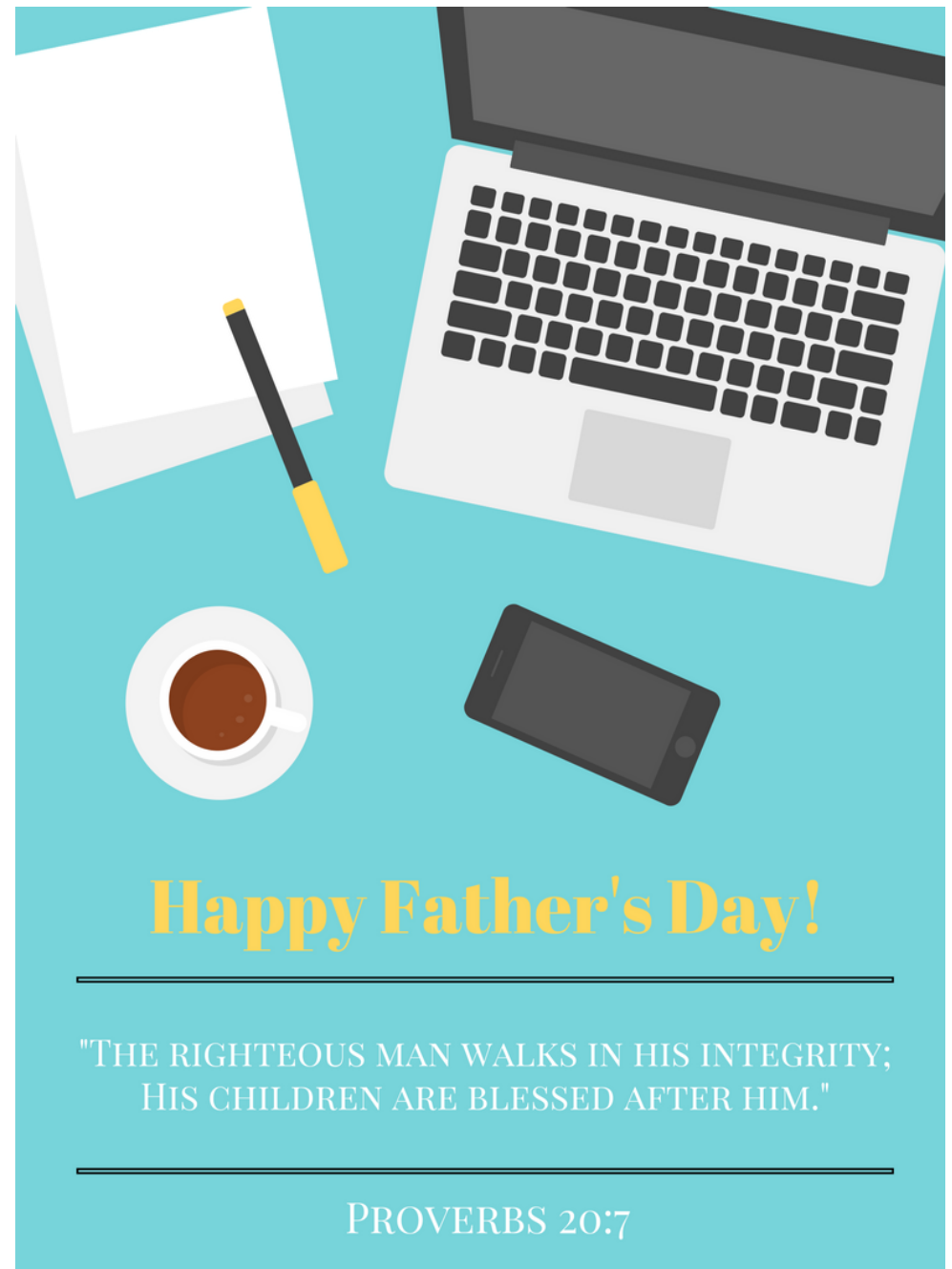

Thoughts for a Godly Father

Your mind is not distinct from your *heart*. And your behavior doesn't exist in isolation from your thoughts and feelings. In fact, the Bible frequently speaks of how important it is to guard your *heart* above all else, "for it is the wellspring of life" (*Proverbs 4:23*).

In other words, as your *heart* goes, so goes the rest of your life.

Now, when the Bible talks about our *hearts*, we must not only think about our feelings. We must realize that the *heart* reveals our primary disposition. Biblically speaking, the *heart* comprises our will, our intellect, our conscience and emotions. Your *heart* is the you inside of you that makes you *you*. When we talk about the *heart*, we're talking about the foundation of your whole being.

God has always wanted more from us than behavior modification. He wants a true change of *heart*.

Josiah's revival lasted just one generation because, while the people's behavior changed, their *hearts* did not. God told Jeremiah, who was a prophet during the lifetime of Josiah, "Judah did not return to me with all her *heart*, but only in pretense" (*Jeremiah 3:10*). God's solution? "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their *hearts*" (*Jeremiah 31:33*). In other words, God would transform us from the inside out.

Which do we value more? Good behavior or a real renovation of the *heart*?

Behavior is important. Morality is important. But if the behavior is not motivated by a true change of *heart*, behavioral change is short-lived at best.

Real life-change happens from the inside out. Jesus wants us to hand our *hearts* over to Him so that He can replace our old, sin-soaked *hearts* with brand-new ones, setting in motion an internal process of renovation that will lead us to something better than better behavior. Jesus plans on making us into the right kind of person who does the right thing at the right time in the right way for the right reason.

That's true righteousness. And that's Jesus' aim for us. Is it your aim as well?
