Resolved unanimously that the Sum of eighty pounds be raised & levied on the Inhabitants of the Parishes of Dromdaleague & Caharah, four years at twenty pounds a year, towards building a new Church at Dromdaleague.

That the first Sum of twenty pounds, for this year, be equally applotted on the Inhabitants or Occupiers of Land in the said parishes of Dromdaleague & Caharah, by the Church Wardens, the Church Wardens elect, Mess.rs Abra.m Jagoe, William Evans, George Ross, Thomas Beamish, Coleman Walsh, Will: Cotter, Cha.s Regan, Will: Kingston, Tho.s Kingston, or any five of them.

Resolved unanimously that Mess.rs John Taylor of Keelskohonagh in the Parish of Dromdaleague & Thomas Ross of Cooragannif in the Parish of Caharah are fit persons to act as Church Wardens for said parishes & they are hereby elected Church Wardens of the Parishes of Dromdaleague & Caharah for the ensuing year.

Resolved unanimously that the Sum of ten pounds be levied on the Inhabitants of the united Parishes of Dromdaleague & Caharah, as a Maintenance for George Burzue the Parish Clerk, and that said Sum be equally applotted on the said Inhabitants, or Occupiers of Land by the above mentioned applotters or any five of them.

Mess.rs John Taylor & Thomas Ross Churchwardens in the year 1782 this day produced their Accounts, & it appeared that the sum of eighteen pounds one shilling & ten pence has been paid to the Rev.d Archdeacon Tisdall towards rebuilding the Church of Dromaleague, & that a Ballance of one pound five shillings Stg is still due which they promise to pay to the Incumbent of these parishes on Demand.

Mess.rs Thomas Evans & Thomas Baldwin late Church Wardens produced their Accounts, when it appeared that one pound Sixteen Shillings was uncollected in the parish of Dromaleague & Seven pounds Seven Shillings & ten pence half penny in the parish of Caharah, which they promise to exert themselves in recovering with all possible Expedition, & to pay over the Ballance due from them to the Rev.d Archdeacon Tisdall towards rebuilding Dromaleague Church on Demand.
