*“Getting to the Point About Being a Servant”*

Getting you thinking: *“Where are you on the pecking order?”*

**I. Mark gets right to the point about servanthood!**

- A. vs.35-37: The unexpected big request of James and John (and their mother)
- B. Why were they asking a question like *that*?
- C. vs.38,39: What did Jesus think about that idea? What did he say back to them?
- D. v.39: Did they think they could do it?
- E. v.39: Now, was it true that they would kind of be like Jesus one day?
- F. v.41: And what did the other disciples think when they heard about this?
- G. vs.42-45: So, what did Jesus say to these squabbling disciples?
  - Is that the way it is in *your world*?
  - *Who do you know* who lives and leads like that?

**II. How do we apply these words of Jesus to our lives, our leadership, and ministries today?**
